Today the Church celebrates the Feast of St Aloysius Gonzaga. Whether it is an accident of history or the work of the Holy Spirit when one meets a saint, one often meets multiple saints. This is just as true in the life of St Aloysius as anywhere. St Aloysius received his first communion from St Charles Borromeo and was formed by St Robert Bellarmine during his time in the Society of Jesus.

It is no coincidence that saints are found in clusters. This is because Christianity is difficult to live alone. The scriptures tell us that just as "Iron is sharpened by iron; one person sharpens another." (Proverbs 27:17) The people who surround us have a profound influence on us.

This is a truth that we must recapture. All too often today we are told that faith is a private matter, or that there is no room for it in the public square. But our faith is communal by nature. Basil Hume OSB, the Cardinal Archbishop of Westminster, is quoted as saying 'Faith is always personal, but it is never individual'.

Jesuits like St Aloysius Gonzaga refer to their fellow Jesuits as 'friends in the Lord'. Can we be, to all we meet, friends in the Lord, formed by His example and close to Him?

Northumbria University: On Tuesday 9th July we have our campus visit to Northumbria University. Details have been emailed to parents.


