Yesterday, the Church celebrated the feast of St Benedict, abbot, patron of religious orders. St Benedict is considered to be the father of Western Monasticism and wrote the book on monastic life.

The Gospel of the day gives the first rules for a holy life. The disciples are told to go out and share the word. They are to tell the people that the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand. It's now. The disciples are the first to share the good news, to minister to the people. They are told to heal the sick and to cast out demons. They are told to do it because it is the right and appropriate thing to do, not to get rich, but to help people. The disciples are told to help others and to tell their story.

This is the basis of the church, the basis that St Benedict built on. These are the beginnings that we should all remember even today. We have a Gospel to proclaim and it is good news for all throughout the earth.

Arrangements for the end of the Academic Year

The Easter Term and the Academic Year end Friday 19th July 2024. As in previous years, the school will close earlier than usual on this day.
